



Duchesne alumni move up to new positions



Duchesne High School recently announced the appointments of Paul Boschert '77 as President and Renee (Reimer) Moore '86 as Athletic Director, the position previously held by Boschert.

"We are pleased to welcome Paul into this new role and are excited to see his leadership and vision take Duchesne into the next era," stated Jack Borgmeyer '97, Secretary of the Board of Directors. "We are confident Paul will be instrumental in advancing our strategic goals, ensuring that Duchesne will continue to innovate and excel."

Paul holds an impressive 43 years in education, with 23 served as an athletic administrator. An alumnus of Duchesne High School, he has spent time at several educational institutions and brings a wealth of knowledge and experience that will benefit colleagues, students, and the Duchesne community.

Paul's educational career

began in 1981 when he returned to Duchesne High School after graduating from Lindenwood University. During his first tenure at Duchesne, he both taught and coached. He then spent more than a decade teaching physical education in the St. Charles School District, and transitioned to the role of Director of Athletics and Activities at St. Charles West High School before assuming the role of Director of Athletics and Activities at Fort Zumwalt West High School in 2003. Following a successful 16 years at Fort Zumwalt West Paul returned to Duchesne High School as Athletics Director in 2020.

Over the course of his career, Paul has hired, mentored and supervised more than 130 coaches, as well as overseen and directed more than 80 different athletic programs. He was awarded St. Louis Area Athletic Director of the Year for 2017-2018 and was inducted into the Gateway Athletic Conference Hall of Fame in 2015 as part of the inaugural class.

In addition to Paul's career responsibilities, he has served on both the Investigative and Sportsmanship committees of the Missouri State High School Activities Association.

"Paul's strongest attributes are his communication and organizational skills. Specif-

ically, his friendly demeanor, people skills, and knack for putting others at ease in difficult situations are his best assets," Borgmeyer said.



Renee Moore joined the faculty at Duchesne in 1990 after attending the University of Missouri—St. Louis on a volleyball scholarship. She graduated magna cum laude with a Bachelor of Science degree in Secondary Education and certification in Business and Social Studies.

She was previously in the role of Assistant Athletic Director, in addition to long serving Duchesne's students as a teacher and academic dean, as a moderator and mentor, as a coach, and as Assistant Admissions Director.

"The Duchesne community is looking forward to seeing Renee in her new position as Athletic Director," stated President Boschert. "I have had the pleasure of working with Re-

nee as my assistant in the Athletic Department the past couple of years and she has been an outstanding asset to me and to our athletic program. She is loyal, dedicated, and well-respected by the Duchesne community and will serve Pioneer Nation well in her new role."

Renee will continue teaching at Duchesne as well. She believes providing opportunities for problem-solving is the best way for students to learn, and her classes are known for the creative and interactive methods Renee uses to encourage and challenge her students. Outside of the classroom, Renee has made it a point to attend as many games and other extracurriculars as possible. "I love interacting with the kids outside of the classroom; it gives me a whole other perspective and helps me get to know them better," she said. Renee will apply that ability to connect with students in her new post.

She continued, "I am grateful for the opportunity to step into the position of Athletic Director. My experiences as athlete, coach, parent, and educator have helped me develop an understanding of the positive impact that competing in sports has in life. I am excited to take on this new role and am fortunate to be inheriting



Rhys Boschert '96 wins silver with Team USA in the Inline Hockey World Championship



In his second year playing in the Veterans Division (45 and older) for Team USA in the Inline Hockey World Championship, Rhys Boschert '96 led his team in scoring with 12 points across the 7-game tournament. Those included a hat trick in the first game against Brazil and game-winning goals in both the quarterfinal playoff win against Czechia and the semi-final playoff win against Sweden.

Like last year, Rhys' team advanced to the Gold medal game vs. France. Team USA came back from a 2-goal deficit in the last few minutes

to tie it up and take the game to overtime. Neither team scored in a 10-minute OT period, and then France won in the shootout to take home the Gold, with Team USA earning the Silver medal.

"Playing for your country is a great honor, and we have a great group of guys who keep in touch and root for each other year-round at the regional tournaments most of us attend," Rhys said.

Rhys began playing hockey at the age of 10, honing his craft at the McNair Park tennis courts with his neighborhood friends. He went

on to play inline hockey for Truman State University, helping the team to multiple top-3 finishes in the nation. He then played for a year as a grad student at Lindenwood University, where he helped them win their first-ever Inline Hockey National Championship in 2002.

Rhys plays year-round in local leagues multiple times a week and in tournaments throughout the country. He flew straight from the World Championships in Spain to Tampa for the TORHS (Tournament of Roller Hockey Series) national event, where his team won

Gold in both the 35+ and 40+ divisions. To keep in shape he attends Burn Boot Camp Gym, where his wife, Stacy, is a trainer.

"I have to give a lot of credit to my awesome wife, Stacy, for not only being a great motivator toward me keeping in shape as I get older but also for allowing me to travel all over the country and world to play a game for fun. I'm a lucky guy!," Rhys said.

Rhys and Stacy live in O'Fallon and have four kids: Eli (23), Stella (21), Penelope (10), and Evelyn (8).

Congratulations to our Duchesne Baseball Team for winning the Missouri Class 3 State Championship!

Duchesne hosted the District Tournament at the Bridgeton Municipal Athletic Complex, where the Pioneers defeated Whitfield 8-3 in the semifinals.

The district championship game against Priory turned into an instant classic. Duchesne, leading 5-4 in the top of the 7th, was 3 outs away from a win, but our opponents scored 4 runs to take an 8-5 lead and were poised to end the Pioneers' season. Duchesne was not phased and plated 3 runs in the bottom of the 7th, sending the game into extra innings. Priory was held scoreless in the top of the 8th and the Pioneers were hoping to end it in the home half of the inning. Duchesne had the winning run on base when Anthony Painter had the biggest hit of his career, driving in the game-winning run with a walk-off base hit and giving the Pioneers a 9-8 District Championship win.

The team moved on to the state playoffs in Hermann, where they defeated the Bearcats 6-2 in the sectional game and advanced to the state quarterfinals, where the Pioneers scored early and often and easily defeated North Calaway 14-1.

Duchesne then progressed to the Final 4 in Ozark. In the state semifinals, our boys scored 4 runs in the first and 4 more in the second. The defense turned 4 double plays, and the Pioneers defeated Licking 10-3.

In the championship game, the Pioneers again scored early with 6 runs in the first two innings and, behind the great pitching of TJ

The Pioneers outscored their opponents 39-6 after the district championship game and were never in any "nail-biting" games throughout the championship run!
