Congratulations to Bridget Caldwell, who was awarded 1st place in the 12th District for the VFW's Voices of Democracy!

Voices of Democracy is an audio essay competition for high school students sponsored by the Veterans of Foreign Wars.

Entrants first have to win at their post level, then a district winner is chosen which advances to state, and eventually leads to nationals to compete for a \$35,000 college scholarship.

"I feel honored to represent the 12th District at state," said Caldwell.

On February 10 she will travel to Columbia, Missouri, where all the district winners will be presented jackets, and then given private tours through the capital building, Missouri Military Museum, and the Missouri State Highway Patrol Museum.

Capstone project supports local charity

One Duchesne High School senior is making a real difference for a local non-profit organization.

On Friday, December 15, Julia Winkeler '24 presented Gwendolyn's Gifts with a check for \$1,650 that she raised through several fundraisers she planned as the culmination of her Scholars Academy auxiliary courses. Gwendolyn's Gifts is a charity that supports the families of children on palliative and hospice care in St. Louis and surrounding areas. It was created in 2019 by DHS alumna Erin Kramer '04 and her husband, Mark.

Duchesne's Scholars Academy program is the high school version of a university-level master's thesis, building on concepts learned in previous courses. Students design, execute, and defend a semester-long project while establishing professional relationships and refining collaboration skills.

Throughout the fall semester, Winkeler raised money for the local charity through bake sales, a Halloween craft night, and a Santa's workshop event.

"For my bake sales, I have always made it important to choose a charity that benefits pediatric care," said Julia. "I was introduced to Gwendolyn's Gifts by Mrs. [Renee] Moore and thought it was the perfect charity for my cap-

stone project, especially since Erin Kramer is a Duchesne alum."

"Julia and I met weekly to make sure her project was on course," said Duchesne Academic Dean, teacher, and Capstone Advisor Renee Moore '86. "From the beginning, Julia's goal was to give back, and she was dedicated to this goal from the first day of the semester. In my estimation, Julia surpassed her goal of raising money as she also raised awareness to members of the Duchesne community, not just about the charity Gwendolyn's Gifts, but the significance of finding something you are passionate

about and going for it!"

Erin and Mark Kramer were inspired to create the charity by their oldest daughter, Gwendolyn, who courageously fought a progressive neurological condition for eight years before passing away on May 12, 2023.

"When I heard about Julia's decision to dedicate her senior capstone project to raising money for Gwendolyn's Gifts, I felt proud of her without even knowing her!" said Kramer. "Anytime I witness kids helping kids, I am so thankful and inspired to see compassion and empathy in the next generation!"

The project has made a significant impression on Winkeler as well.

"The success of my project makes me feel honored to have been given the opportunity to have made all of this possible. Without the support and encouragement from the Duchesne community, I would not have been able to make such a big impact for this charity," she said.

"It was truly wonderful to come back to the high school and be a part of Julia's check presentation to Gwendolyn's Gifts," said Kramer. "A special project completed by a special girl in a special place!"

Retired DHS coach inducted into MFCFA Hall of Fame

On Friday, December 8, retired Duchesne football coach and educator Charlie Elmendorf '76 joined the ranks of other esteemed coaches when the Missouri Football Coaches Association (MFCFA) inducted him into their Hall of Fame. Coach Elmendorf received the honor in front of friends and family at an induction ceremony held at Margaritaville Lake Resort in Osage Beach, Missouri.

Coach Elmendorf retired in 2022 after 27 years of coaching football at Duchesne — the longest coaching tenure in the history of the school's football program. Career highlights include eight conference titles, eight district titles, eight state quarterfinal games, two state semifinal games, and the winningest football record with 164 wins. He also

led the girls basketball program for 11 years, reaching the state semifinals in 2001, winning the state championship in 2003, and a state finals appearance in 2004. He was inducted into the St. Louis Metropolitan Football Coaches Association (SLM-FCA) Hall of Fame in 2021.

"His induction into the [MFCFA] Hall of Fame is a testimony to his successful 44 years coaching football," said Duchesne Athletics Director Paul Boschert '77. "It is a well-deserved honor for the most intense and competitive teammate I have ever played with and coached against."

Inductees to the MFCFA Hall of Fame must meet four criteria:

- A coach shall serve a minimum of 20 years as a

head football coach in the state of Missouri.

- A coach shall have earned an exceptional win-loss record and district, conference, and state championships.

- A coach shall be an outstanding representative of his community and profession.

- A coach should be recognized as an active member of the MFCFA.

Current members meet yearly and vote on the next "class." Elmendorf was among 14 other individuals nominated this year.

Curtis Jasper, head football coach at Joplin High School, MFCFA vice president and secretary for the Hall of Fame Committee, is a friend of Elmendorf and

sponsored his nomination. The two met at Central Methodist University team camp in Fayette, Missouri, in the early 2000s, and Jasper has traced Elmendorf's career since then.

"When guys like him make an impact, you always kind of follow their teams," said Jasper. "I was happy to be there [that] night and watch him go in."

"I am honored and blessed to have been inducted into the [SLMFCFA] Hall of Fame in 2021 and the [MFCFA] Hall of Fame this year," said Elmendorf. "These incredible honors are because of the support of my family and all of the great people I have been influenced, guided, and inspired by throughout my life and career... without all of you, none of these honors would be possible."

Father and Son on a Mission

A Duchesne High School father and son duo traveled to Mexico on a mission trip that was an incredible bonding experience and an opportunity to make a real difference in the lives of the people they served.

Dave Hermann and his son, Nolan '25, traveled to a community just south of Tijuana, Mexico, in late November to join in a house build as a part of Homes of Hope, a program run by Youth With a Mission (YWAM) where family, business, or church groups build a new home in roughly two days for a needy family. YWAM is a global movement of Christians dedicated to serving Jesus Christ worldwide.

"My parent company, Wiese, has sponsored these trips over the last two years," said Dave. "This was the fourth or fifth planned trip. One of my employees has been on three of them now, and it inspired me to give it a try."

The two joined other volunteers, some of whom were locals who had homes built for them as children. Hermann's company provided enough volunteers to do two separate house builds for two families.

"The build itself was something Nolan and I will never forget," said Dave. "Of course, over the years, everyone sees pictures and videos of the many less fortunate around the world, but being there in person, meeting the family we were helping, and really getting to see what their life was like was quite the eye opener. It really puts things in perspective."

"For me, the mission trip was a very eye-opening experience," said Nolan. "It allowed me to see how the other half

of the world lives and allowed me to realize how lucky I am."

One of the families was a young couple with a 3-year-old boy and a baby on the way. They had been living in a shelter made of plywood and tarps. By the end of the second day, their new home

was complete, and the young parents received the keys.

Dave explains that along with the build itself, one of the joys of the project is getting to know the families and seeing the effect their work has on their lives.

"They were so grateful for what hopefully will be a life-changing event for them and the children," he said.

"Building the house was all worth it when you could see the looks on the family's faces coming back to see their new home," said Nolan.

This was the Hermann's first mission trip with YWAM, and it seems it will not be the last.

"I would love to go back again with Nolan or even bring other members of my family," said Dave. "It's amazing how close you can get to someone in just 48 hours while doing something like this."
