## Duchesne Delivers - Science Accomplishments

## PROJECT POLLINATOR

Maggie Dultz '21 created Project Pollinator in the spring of 2019, just outside of the band room doors to our school. Many passersby have noticed the garden, one even wondering if they should call the police when they saw someone "doing something over by the side door bushes" well after school hours!

Project Pollinator is a native pollination garden which includes bee hotels consisting of tubes on posts, as well as specific flowers planted to attract butterflies, bees, and other pollinators. The space is designed

to attract and breed species native to our area, some of which are endangered.

As a member of Duchesne's Scholars Academy, Maggie chose to plant and cultivate Project Pollinator as her sophomore year STEM project. Second year participants in our Scholars Academy choose a real-life idea in the areas of science, technology, engineering, and/or math, and work on that project throughout the school year.

Maggie was inspired to develop her pollination garden after a conversation with her mom, Ruth (Sebacher) Dultz '82, who works at the St. Louis Zoo. Ruth suggested Maggie do a project connected to helping endangered species. Maggie planned and planted the garden, coming up to school to water and care for it, even as the school year transitioned into summer break. She will tend the garden until her graduation in May 2021. It is Maggie's hope to establish a Green Team to help continue with the care of the space in the years to come.

#### ROBOTICS FOR THE FUTURE

The future is upon us at DHS! Brandon Stringer has been teaching a Robotics course for almost four years and each year the class has increased in popularity. Mr. Stringer indicated that more and more seniors are taking Robotics as a precursor to college majors in the areas of engineering, computer programming, and cyber security.

In the first half of the semester, students are encouraged to use their imagination for what they would like to build and then taught the mechanics of robot building. The construction of each individual robot takes place in the latter half of the semester. After a student has built his or her own robot, Mr. Stringer teaches them how to program it to do what the student has envisioned, literally bringing to life what they had imagined!







Students are given a budget of \$100 each to create the robot of their choice. Past projects have included cars, drones, and mechanical hands.

Mr. Stringer has the students write papers on their project, reflecting on what they learned from the class and what their plans are for the future. He teaches the class in a college-style format, challenging our students and measuring their progress by the skills they develop and exhibit, rather than by measuring their newly-gained knowledge with traditional exams. Often times, Mr. Stringer will host competition quizzes, where the students race the clock to build parts of their robots. Specific times of completion are graded, much like what our students will experience in their college courses ahead.





#### WHAT IS PLANNED GIVING?

Creating a Planned Gift enables individuals like you to make larger gifts to Duchesne High School than you could make from ordinary income. Planned Giving is sometimes referred to as Gift Planning or Legacy Giving.

All Planned Gifts are created during the lifetime of you, the donor. Some Planned Gifts, however, are completed during your lifetime as part of your financial planning process, while others will not be completed until after your lifetime and are therefore part of your estate plan.



Planned Gifts can be divided into three distinct categories:

#### GIVE NOW:

Typically a gift of appreciated assets, the gift will either create a new endowment fund or add to an existing endowment fund at the Roman Catholic Foundation to benefit Duchesne High School. The appropriate tax deduction is provided to the donor by the Foundation.

#### **GIVE LATER:**

Typically a gift made through language in your will or trust, by beneficiary designation on an IRA or Insurance Policy, or as a beneficiary on a piece of property. The estate will receive appropriate acknowledgment of the gift from the Foundation.

#### **GIVE & RECEIVE:**

Typically, such a gift is centered on either the creation of a Charitable Gift Annuity or a Charitable Remainder Trust. In both circumstances, a gift (typically of a highly appreciated asset) is made to the Foundation and the donor receives an agreed-upon income stream for a period of time. As the donor, you will receive a taxdeduction in accordance with tax laws in effect at the time the gift is received by the Foundation.

Whether a donor uses cash, appreciated securities/stock, real estate, artwork, partnership interests, personal property, life insurance, a retirement plan, etc., the benefits of funding a Planned Gift can make this type of charitable giving very attractive to both you and Duchesne High School.
